1. Call to approve the March minutes

5. Bylaw Reviews

A discussion about pro-rating membership occurred after which Christine motioned that membership (no matter the time of entry) be for one calendar year only. Elyse seconded the motion. The reference of "purebred" was removed from the bylaws. Heidi motion to accept the revised bylaw document to be put to the membership for a vote of approval. Danielle seconded.

6. Langston University Research Project

Heidi shared that the University is awaiting a final confirmation regarding approval of funds. Focus on having members test and register their goats should be primary in preparation for the project. Ideas of how to increase the number of registered goats occurred. Ideas included featuring a well-established buck on CGA's IN and FB pages to see who has the offspring for a Cashmere Goat Registration Drive .

7. Educational Seminars

Danielle shared that Teas A &M fiber Lab will be offering the next webinar in April. Featured scientists and lab experts will be on hand to demonstrate how a fiber sample is tested using different machines.

Danielle is also part of the group from CGA in dialogue with Texas A & M in which cashmere samples will be provided by a farm to be used in an experiment to compare and potentially calibrate results with different machines.

The CGA board unanimously agreed that if there is a cost associated for the testing procedure it should be covered by CGA funds. Danielle will keep the board informed as to if this is necessary.

- David D. and his wife Mary have volunteered to start the process of indexing present and past issues of Hoofprints This will allow for the vast amount of information they contain to be accessed based on topic.
- Wendy proposed that we change the scorecard because it refers to fiber uniformity (uniformity of diameter within a single fiber), which can only be measured by a lab.
 We will remove uniformity from the card and replace "cover" with "consistency".
 "Cover" can only be measured on a live goat, but consistency can be judged by examining multiple samples from a fleece.
